Professional Doctorate Degrees (Level 10)

Doctor of Māori Development and Advancement (MDA) and Doctor of Indigenous Development and Advancement (IDA) doctoral degrees designed for students in professional areas. These degrees consider the working experiences of students and encourage them to consider how their community or indigenous organisations.

Choosing the right degree

The point of difference between the two degrees is that the IDA is primarily for those who work in an indigenous context or have a responsibility for indigenous aspects within their employment, including international students. The MDA is primarily for those who are employed within Māori organisations, for example, working within an iwi or government context.
