

## He Whakahōnore i a Tā Harawira Gardiner

I tēnei rā ka whakapāhōtia e te Heamana Tuarua o Te Kaunihera Mana Whakahaere o Awanuiārangi a Rauru Kirikiri rāua ko Kelvin Davis, te Minita mō Oranga Tamariki te whakarewatanga o Te Whakaruruhanu mō te Tamaiti o Tā Harawira Gardiner.

I whakatūhia he rā whakahōnore i a Tā Wira Gardiner, i Te Whare Wānanga o Awanuiārangi, mo āna mahi i roto i ngā tau rima tekau mā waru mō te Kāwana, me ana mahi kaihautu mō ngā tari kāwangatanga puta noa i te motu, me tana tū hei tūmau i roto i ngā kaupapa mōrearea o Aotearoa, i waenganui i te Karauna me ngā iwi.

I whakawhiwhia te hōnore tākutatanga mai i Te Whare Wānanga o Waikato me te tohu – Spirit of Service Lifetime Achievement Award mai i te Kawa Mataaho, te Kōmihana Ratonga Mahi ā-Iwi a te Kāwanatanga, me te Tohu Tiketike mai i te wānanga. Ko ia hoki tētahi o ngā kaiwhakahaere tuatahi, ā, ko te hua i puta mahi ko te whakatūtanga o Te Whare Whakaruruhanu Kaupapa Rangahau Gardiner.

E ai ki te hoa rangatira me te kaikōrero o te whānau, a Hekia Parata, “Ka mīharo ake mātou mō Wira, āna mahi katoa i tutuki i a ia, ēngari, ki a mātou – he pāpā aroha pūmau, he koroua, he pāpara, he hoa pai, he tangata manaaki, atawhai hoki. Ko te Whare Whakaruruhanu o Gardiner, he mea tino pai hei whakatūturu i ana mahi i roto i tōna ao, hei whakamahi mā ngā reanga tamariki e piki ake ana”.

Kua whakakotahi mai Te Wānanga me te Kōmihana Ratonga Mahi ā-Iwi a te Kāwanatanga mō te taumata whakahirahira a tēnei Ratonga Kaiarataki, ka whakamanatia mai te tūranga Heamana me Te Whare Whakaruruhanu o Gardiner, me te manawanui ki te rangahau mahi mō te painga atu mō ngā whakatipuranga, me te hanga kia taikaha ake a Aotearoa.

Kei te tino harikoa a Ahorangi Wiremu Doherty, Te Tumu Whakarae o Te Whare Wānanga o Awanuiārangi mō te whakamanatanga i te tūranga Heamana me Te Whare Whakaruruhanu o Gardiner.

“Ko te tautoko i te tūranga Heamana me Te Whare Whakaruruhanu Gardiner, ka hāngai tika hei tūranga taketake mō ngā mahi ka oti i te whānuitanga o te wānanga, me te whai whakaaro i ngā mahi ōhāki ā Tā Wira i ā ia i noho hei Ratonga Kaiarataki mā te Kāwana, me tana mauritau ki roto i ngā momo hāpori katoa, me te huri o tana kāpehu ki te ara mahi, me tōna whakapono ka aro nui, ki tō tātou whenua kanorau.” Ko Te Whare Whakaruruhanu o Gardiner, te tuatahi o te whakanuitanga o ngā kaupapa a Awanuiārangi ki Te Whanganui a Tara, ka whai wāhi ki te whakapiki ake i te whakawhanaungatanga i waenganui I te Karauna me te Māori, tae atu ki te kounga me te tūturutanga ka uru ki ngā mahi kāwanatanga o Aotearoa.

Ka kitea e te Wānanga, he huarahi whakatipu kaha tēnei i motu whānui, me te whakahōnore ano i te whai ake i ngā takahitanga o tētahi tonu o rātou, me te kawe i ana mahi ma nga ratonga Arataki Kāwana ā-hāpori mō ēnei rā, haere ake nei.
